Environmental Grant

- We submitted an Elizabeth Schultz Environmental Grant with the Douglas County Community Foundation October 1st for an initiative at the Eudora Early Childhood Education Program "Path to Zero Waste Preschool"
- Environmental issues are complex and often very difficult for preschool students to understand. Our goal is to create a pathway to a zerowaste preschool by creating a waste reduction, recycle, compost, food recovery, and education program. Our students' direct participation and experience in the program will allow them to better understand their role in solutions to complex environmental issues.
- Our fingers are crossed for positive news, we should hear back from DCCF by mid-November. We requested a total \$4849 for the grant with a \$650 match from ESF and \$1400 match from USD#491.

- I am working with Kaitlyn at the Douglas County Extension to coordinate follow-up with those that were interested more involvement after our Health Equity Forum we hosted in August.
- Save the Date Principal for a Half Day is scheduled for Friday, March 6th (we had previously had it scheduled for Feb 28th)
- In November, we are collaborating with our School Resource Officer, Caleb Lewis and LMH Health Foundation to bring in a national speaker on Vaping. There will be a parent workshop the night prior to the EMS & EHS student presentations. More information to come.
- It is our hope to continue Operation Caring for this academic year. Last year we provided 44 students (PK, EES, EMS & EHS) with the
 opportunity for a \$100 shopping excursion where they had the dignity of selecting their own clothing, in addition, to lunch at Buffalo Wild
 Wings with the principal. Operation Caring relies on a \$5,000 budget that we receive from Cardinal Care Fund donations.
